The author openly and honestly describes everything from the shocking loss of his daughter to his eventual emotional recovery. Step by step, he works his way back from the deepest despair.

Bernstein, Judith; When the Bough Breaks; January 1997

This book presents a breakthrough concept of mourning, documenting the process of evolution from initial grief to an altered outlook on life. Excerpts from interviews with 50 parents who lost children from age five to forty-five trace the road from utter devastation to a revised view of life.
